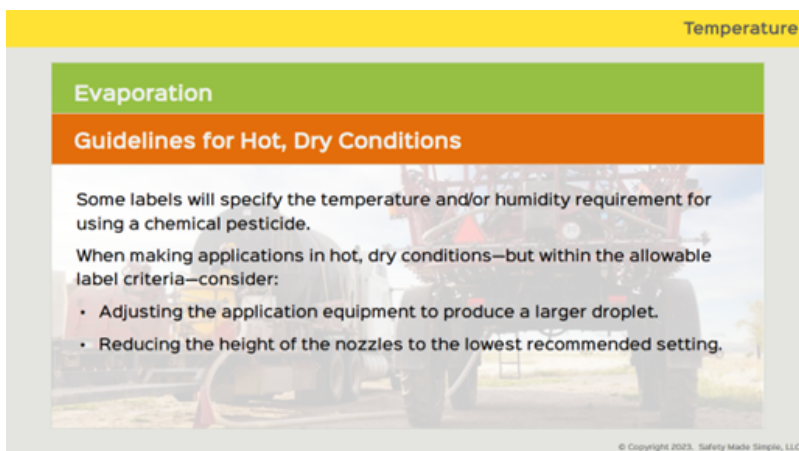

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) estimates that about 2,000 U.S. workers sustain job-related eye injuries requiring medical treatment each day. ## Is It Safe?



### Is it Safe? Not even close!

According to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), the minimum perpendicular clearance between fixed ladder rungs and any obstruction behind the ladder is 7 inches. Ladders with obstructions closer than 7 inches make it challenging to maintain footing on the ladder. The best boots for ladders have anti-slip soles with a right-angled heel that is at least a half inch in height.
