



#### NO WAY!

The quick connect buckle on this harness is corroded. Remember to inspect fall protection harnesses prior to use and remove them from service when showing signs of damage, deterioration, or wear. The inspection should include:

Webbing - Look for frayed edges, pulled stitches, cuts, burns, and chemical damage.

**D-Rings/Back Pads** – Check D-rings for distortion and cracks, breaks and rough or sharp edges. The D-ring should pivot freely and be free of damage and wear.

Attachment Buckles – Inspect for unusual wear, frayed or cut fibers, and broken stitching on the buckle or D-ring attachments.

Tongue/Grommets – Look for loose, distorted or broken grommets.

Tongue Buckles – Buckle tongues should be free of distortion. They should overlap the buckle frame and move freely back and forth in their socket.

Friction and Mating Buckles – Inspect the buckle for distortion. The outer bars and center bars must be straight.

Quick Connect Buckles – Inspect the buckle for distortion. The outer bars and center bars must be straight. Ensure that the dual-tab release mechanism is free of debris and engages properly.

Fall Arrest Indicators – Harnesses are equipped with fall indicators that indicate whether the equipment has been subjected to the forces associated with a fall. To learn more about fall indicators be sure to read the user manual provided by the manufacturer.
