Is It Safe?

You Bet!

Red danger tape is used for areas where immediate hazards of a higher degree exist. This might include suspended loads, work being performed overhead, holes and floor openings, unguarded equipment, or live electrical conductors. Red danger tape requires that the entrant contact the supervisor of the demarcated area prior to entry. There should be a label or tag at each entry point indicating the hazard(s) within the area. The label should also indicate the area's supervisor or contact person and their contact information.
