Review the picture below and then you decide, Is It Safe?



**NO!**

The safety latch on this chain hoist is broken. Safety latches are crucial on lifting hooks, chain ratchets, and chain hoists because they prevent the accidental release of a load. They act as a gate, securing the sling or attachment to the hook, which is essential for preventing injuries from falling loads and protecting equipment from damage.
