

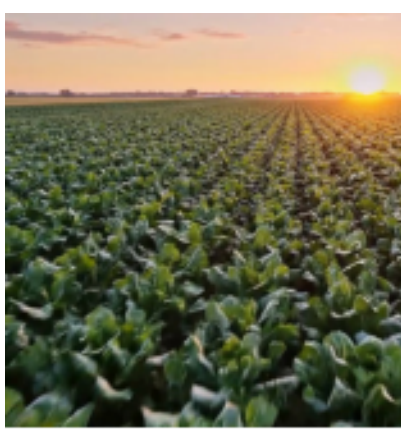

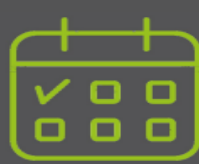

Review the picture below and then you decide, Is It Safe?



ABSOLUTELY NOT!

This is extremely dangerous. OSHA's Construction and General Industry Standards specifically address this issue. To ensure everyone's safety on the job site, it is crucial

that workers always remain standing securely on the platform floor. They should never sit or climb on the platform’s guardrails, nor should they use planks, ladders, or any other devices to change their working position. Safety regulations are established with the explicit purpose of preventing accidents and protecting all personnel. Disregarding these vital guidelines can result in severe injuries or even fatalities, underscoring the importance of strict adherence to established safety standards.
